JMRL STARTS NEW DELIVERY SERVICE

Jefferson-Madison Regional Library and Meals On Wheels of Charlottesville/Albemarle have teamed up to deliver books to local residents who are homebound. The new service started in October. Local residents using the services of Meals on Wheels may have JMRL library items delivered right to their door by Meals on Wheels volunteers. The volunteers will also pick up the items for return. The library's Bookmobile staff will provide all the books and other items, filling requests for specific titles or subjects in multiple formats including large-print and audio.

Meals on Wheels of Charlottesville/Albemarle started in 1977 and currently serves over 270 clients utilizing 185 volunteers each week delivering hot meals on weekdays. The JMRL Bookmobile has served Albemarle and Charlottesville since 1947, and visits assisted living facilities, preschools, and rural neighborhoods.

JMRL PRESENTS THE ELEVENTH ANNUAL BIG READ

A program of the National Endowment for the Arts, NEA Big Read broadens our understanding of our world, our communities, and ourselves through the joy of sharing a good book. This initiative offers grants to support innovative community reading programs designed around a single book. With matching funds from the Jane and Art Hess Foundation, the Friends of the Library enables JMRL to present our eleventh NEA Big Read title, *Silver Sparrow* by Tayari Jones.

Silver Sparrow unveils a breathtaking story about a man's deception, a family's complicity, and the two teenage girls caught in the middle. Set in a middle-class neighborhood in Atlanta during the 1980s, the novel revolves around James Witherspoon's families—the public one and the secret one. When Witherspoon's daughters from each family meet, they form a friendship, but only one of them knows they are sisters. It is a relationship destined to explode when secrets are revealed and illusions shattered. At the heart of it all are two girls whose lives are at stake, and like the best writers, Jones portrays the fragility of her characters with raw authenticity as they seek love, demand attention, and try to imagine themselves as women.
